

ANNUAL REPORT OF SSP

2014 -2015

SSP which comes under the New Initiatives run by the Government of Kerala has been launched in Government colleges, since 2012. SSP envisaged uplifting of slow learners those who study in different classes of different disciplines each year with the help of tutorials, study materials prepared by mentors of respective subjects, additional lectures, question bank setc.

This year SSP is implemented for all Semesters of Degree classes. As per the guidelines, 5 subjects are to be chosen of which, one should be English (Common Course). Considering the result analysis available at the official web site of the Directorate of Collegiate Education and the details of academically weaker students collected from the departments of the college, following subjects are identified. Resource person selection is one of the prime tasks to be carried out since the success of the entire programme depends upon it. As the programme is a focused one, aiming special coaching for students in weak subject areas, the role of the Resource persons is considerable. The Resource person through his classes has to perform the multiple tasks of generating interest in students in the concerned subjects, delivering content and also carrying out an evaluation.

Funds required for this programme allotted by the government for 130 selected students in different disciplines comprised in three years. According to the will of students in the respective subjects, college provided classes for subjects like English, Cost accounting, Major trends in historical thoughts and writings, Physics, Mathematics, Polymer Chemistry, Physical Chemistry etc.

Our college campus has four departments viz- B.Sc (Polymer Chemistry), B.A.(History), B.Com and B.A (Economics). During the academic year 2014-2015, slow learning students of the respective stream in each of the under mentioned disciplines were selected as shown below. Bio data of the students were collected to get a brief idea about them. The programme for the year 2014- 2015 coordinated by Dr. D. V. Anil Kumar, Assistant Professor of Malayalam was completed very successfully at the end of March 2015 .

The classes were conducted on week days from 3.30 Pm to 4.30 pm. On Saturdays the classes were conducted from 10 am to 1.00 pm. Study materials which includes previous years unsolved question papers, simplified notes and work sheets were provided and tests were conducted regularly to improve the performance of slow learners. Majority of students showed remarkable improvement in their academics. Personal interaction with the students helped in identifying and tackling the problems faced by them which in turn resulted in better academic performance
